Full Member\$255.00*Any person who holds an active license, in good standing at the date of application or annual renewal, as a CertifiedPublic Accountant from the Alaska State Board of Accountancy or any other state or political subdivision of theUnited States of America and resides or works within the State of Alaska.
Retired Member\$105.00Any person who, at the date of application or annual renewal, holds or has held an active or inactive license and who is fully retired from gainful occupation and who has attained the age of sixty years.
Non-Resident Member\$105.00Any person who holds an active license, in good standing at the date of application or annual renewal, as a CertifiedPublic Accountant from the Alaska State Board of Accountancy or any other state or political subdivision of theUnited States of America, but who neither resides nor works within the State of Alaska.
Professional Associate\$135.00A member of the professional staff of a Certified Public Accounting firm licensed in the State of Alaska.\$135.00
Candidate Associate\$135.00Has applied for and has been accepted to take the Uniform CPA examination or passed the Uniform CPA examination but whose license is being withheld pending completion of the experience requirement.\$135.00
Academic Associate\$105.00An educator employed full-time teaching accounting or tax or a related subject at an educational institution but who does not hold a CPA license.
Inactive Associate\$135.00Any person who holds a CPA license but having an inactive status and who does not practice public accountancy in Alaska.
Total Due \$
*The sum of not less than \$5.00 shall be added to the dues of members residing or doing business in Alaska and shall be placed in the Paul Hagelbarger Memorial Fund.
Dues paid to the Alaska Society of CPAs are not deductible as a charitable contribution but may be deductible as a business expense; however, the AKCPA estimates that 5% of the dues payment is not deductible as a business expense because of the AKCPA lobbying activities on behalf of its members.
